Hepatitis B Immunisation

Information for parents

Your baby has received their first dose of Hepatitis B vaccination because they are at increased risk of developing Hepatitis B infection. Further doses of vaccination are required to complete the course.

We have documented the vaccination in your baby's red book. We have also notified Child Health Surrey and your GP so further doses of the vaccination can be arranged via your GP practice.

What further doses will be required?

Your baby will need 4 more doses of Hepatitis B vaccination. These will be given at one month, two months, 12 months and a final booster dose with the pre-school immunisations at around 5 years of age.

What else is required?

Your baby will also require a blood test at 1 year of age to check if the intervention has been successful. They will need to have their hepatitis B antigens (HBsAg) checked to see if they have become chronically infected with Hepatitis B.

How will my baby have their blood test?

Your GP will need to arrange this blood test when your baby is 1 year old. Ashford and St. Peter's Hospitals NHS Trust provide a blood test service for children and your GP will be able to request a test for your child. They will then be able to discuss the results with you.

Who should I ask if I have any queries?

The Doctors from the Neonatal service would be happy to answer any questions you may have whilst in hospital. After discharge please discuss any concerns with your midwife or your GP
